

ASL1104 - American Sign Language and Deaf Culture IV

Description:	This course, the fourth in a series of American Sign Language (ASL) and Deaf culture courses, focuses upon the grammatical features of ASL and vocabulary expansion. Content of this course will focus on sentence construction, inflecting verbs and classifiers. Fluency and accuracy of fingerspelling will continue to be developed, along with the use of lexicalized signs and numbering.

Produce and identify targeted vocabulary. 10. Demonstrate advanced ability to converse with members of the Deaf community.
