

## ENGL0098 - Accelerated English

Credits:	3 (3/0/0)
Description:	This course must be taken in conjunction with a linked section of College Writing (ENGL1101) taught by the same instructor. It is designed to prepare students for college-level reading and writing tasks across the disciplines. Students will practice strategies in order to develop reading proficiency and writing skills. They also will engage in all stages of the writing process, from invention and drafting to revising and editing, as they respond to texts and specific writing situations.

Write informative texts to examine a topic and convey ideas over both extended and shorter time frames.</li> <li>9. Responsibly integrate and credit information, ideas, images and other material in writings.</li> <li>10. Demonstrate consistent command of the conventions of standard English grammar, usage, syntax, capitalization, punctuation and spelling in writings.</li> <li>11.
