

## ENGL2322 - Banned Literature

The course focuses primarily on the study of literature, but part of the lectures, discussions and student responses will address the topic of censorship. Students will read from a variety of genres.

Explain how the banned or challenged text is critically received.</li> <li>7. Explain how the banned or challenged text contributes to the literary world.</li> <li>8. Differentiate between contemporary and historical reactions to the banned/challenged literature.</li> <li>9. Interpret the literature within the framework of contemporary theoretical and historical contexts.</li> <li>10. Compose analytical responses and/or essays about the readings.</li> <li>11. Participate in small and large group literary discussions.</li> </ol>
