Fergus Area College Foundation celebrates scholarship recipients

Fergus Area College Foundation (FACF) hosted its annual scholarship reception on Nov. 7 at Legacy Hall on M State's Fergus Falls campus. The event celebrated recent scholarship donors and student recipients. Thanks to the generosity of FACF donors, the foundation is able to support students' academic goals with scholarship awards. In the 2024-2025 academic year, more than \$250,000 was awarded to 140 students.

"We offer a variety of scholarships to both first- and second-year students for classes taken on the Fergus Falls campus of M State," says Jacki Maethner, executive director of the Fergus Area College Foundation. "EVERY student with a grade point average of 2.5 or higher who is taking classes on the Fergus Falls campus was offered the opportunity to receive an automatic scholarship for the 2024-25 academic year. Students also had the opportunity to apply for additional funding, which was awarded according to their demonstrated skills in leadership and community stewardship."

Appropriate for workers at all levels of experience looking to build or sharpen their leadership skills, the sessions in this series are especially geared to those who provide training within an organization.


